### 4.2 Challenges in Integration

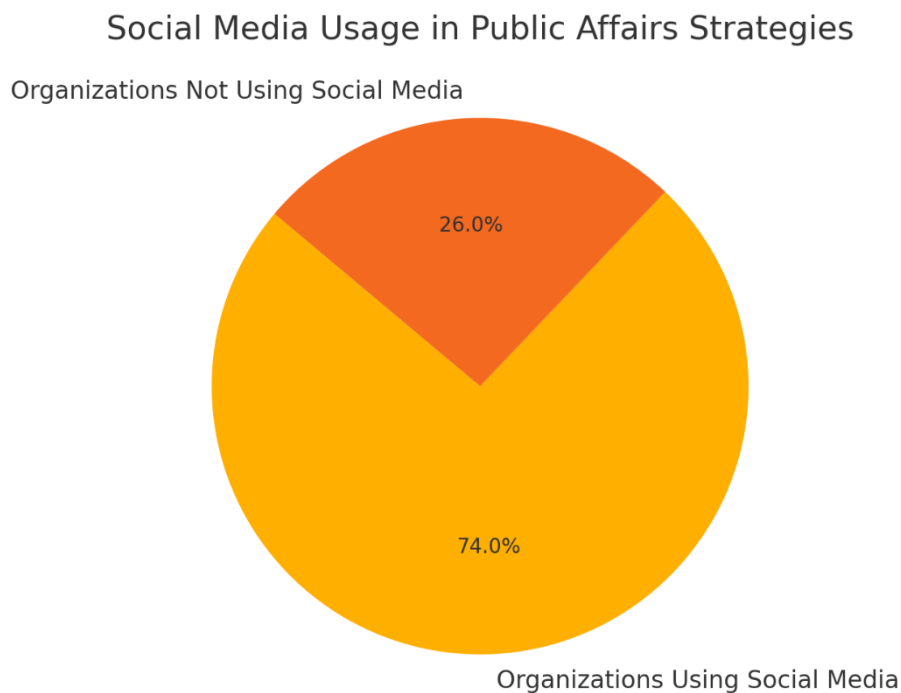
